



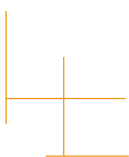

Transportation/ Parking	The Museum is located at Regional Transit Light Rail's Archives Plaza stop. Two hourly garages are open weekdays at 10th and O Streets, as well as 11th Street between N and O Streets. Free parking is available on weekends in a lot across the street from the Museum.
